Autumn Rider Horse Shows

Recognized by: NJPHA, Colonial Classic, Marshall & Sterling League

Every Animal and person entered for competition or on the showgrounds shall be governed by the rules of the Monmouth County Park System and Autumn Riders Horse Shows (ARHS). Furthermore, it is to be understood that activities involving horses are inherently dangerous, that a horse's behavior and actions are unpredictable and can result in property damage, injury or death to animal's participants or spectators and that participation (including spectating) in these activities is at your own risk.

Annual Competitor Membership is required to participant in ARHS year end awards. A competing member may show as many horses as they wish, but each horse must be registered and have a negative Coggins Certificate.

Annual Competitor Membership: \$45.00 Individual * Family \$90.00 2 or more riders.

Competitors must participate in a minimum of three shows in a division to be eligible for Year-End Award in that division. In case of extenuating circumstances, eligibility may be expended at the discretion of the management.

Entry Fee for all claes is \$25.00 unless otherwise noted in the prize list. Office fee is \$40 with a \$15 EMT & grounds fee /\$2.00 back number

6 ribbons will be awarded in each class. A Grand and a Reserve Champion, Shows will run with a "no conflict" policy except for a 5-minute tack change or a 5 minute trainer conflict. The ring starter will make a one minute gate call. If no one responds the gate will close.

Scratches/ Add slips must be submitted at the Secretary Stand before the class.

All Exhibitors are required to wear proper show attire and use appropriate tack for the riding style of the class. All riders are required to wear appropriate boots with a heel. Points for show Championship and Year 6th Place. It is the responsibility of the Rider to ensure that they are eligible to compete in the classes they are enter. Further Specifications and Questions can be answered at the Secretary Stand.

Beginner Rider Equitation

Open to riders of any age. Rider may not have shown in any division, at any show, where the fence height specification is at 2' or higher. Riders may not cross enter into any other division except Beginner Hunter or Pleasure at the same show. Trotting anywhere on course not to be penalized. Fences at under 2'.

Beginner Hunter

Open to all horses and ponies ridden by riders of any age. Fences under 2'. Section A: Rider not to have shown in a division, at any show, where the fence height specification is 2' or higher. Section B: Horse or pony not to have shown in a division where the fence height specification is 2' or higher. Riders in Sec. A may not cross enter into any other division except Beginner Rider Equitation and Pleasure. Trotting anywhere on course not to be penalized.

Short Stirrup Equitation

Open to riders 12 years of age and under as of December 1 of the current show year who have not shown over fences at 2' or higher. Riders may not cross enter into divisions except Short Stirrup Hunter and Pleasure. Fences at under 2'.

Short Stirrup Hunter

Open to riders 12 *years* of age and under as of December 1st of the current show year who have not shown over fences at 2' or higher. Riders may not cross enter into divisions except Short Stirrup Equitation and Pleasure. Fences at under 2'. +

English/Western Leadline *Not before 10:30 am*

Open to Riders 8 years and under as of the current show year.

(NEW) Young Rider Division - *Location: Next to Jumper Ring not before 10:30am*

Open to children in their first year after leadline. Can not have shown in any other division (besides leadline) in any other show. Only eligible for the division for one year. Open to riders ages 10 & under. Riders may be asked to: Halt from the walk, reverse at the walk, drop and regain stirrups or two-point at the walk - 75. Young riders walk only

78. Young riders W/T with judges test (correct diagonals will count)

Mini Stirrup Equitation

Open to riders 10 years of age and under as of December 1st of the current show year who have not shown over fences at 2' or higher or cantered.

Riders may not cross enter in any other division except Mini Stirrup Hunter.

Open to riders 10 years of age or under as of the current show year. Riders not to have shown over fences 2' or higher. Riders may not cross-enter into any other class or division except Mini Stirrup Equitation. Cross Rails at 18".

New Rider/Academy - Location: Next to Jumper Ring not before 10:30am

Open to riders of any age who ride and have not shown in a class required to canter at **ANY** competition. This Division is meant for Riders coming from the Lead Line Division will split if entries warrant – by age **(A) 10**

YEARS & UNDER (B) 11 YEARS AND OLDER - Horses and ponies may use martingales for all classes and may be repeated for students. Riders need not use formal show attire; however they must use an approved helmet and boots with a heel. Riders may not cross enter into any other division.

English Pleasure

Open to all horses and ponies. To be shown in English tack at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged with emphasis on manners and suitability as well as soundness and performance. Must back readily and stand quietly. No more than 6 to hand gallop at the same time. No martingales.

Advanced Equitation

Open to amateur riders of all ages who have not shown over fences exceeding 2'3" at any show. This division may split between adults and juniors if entries warrant.

Modified Rider

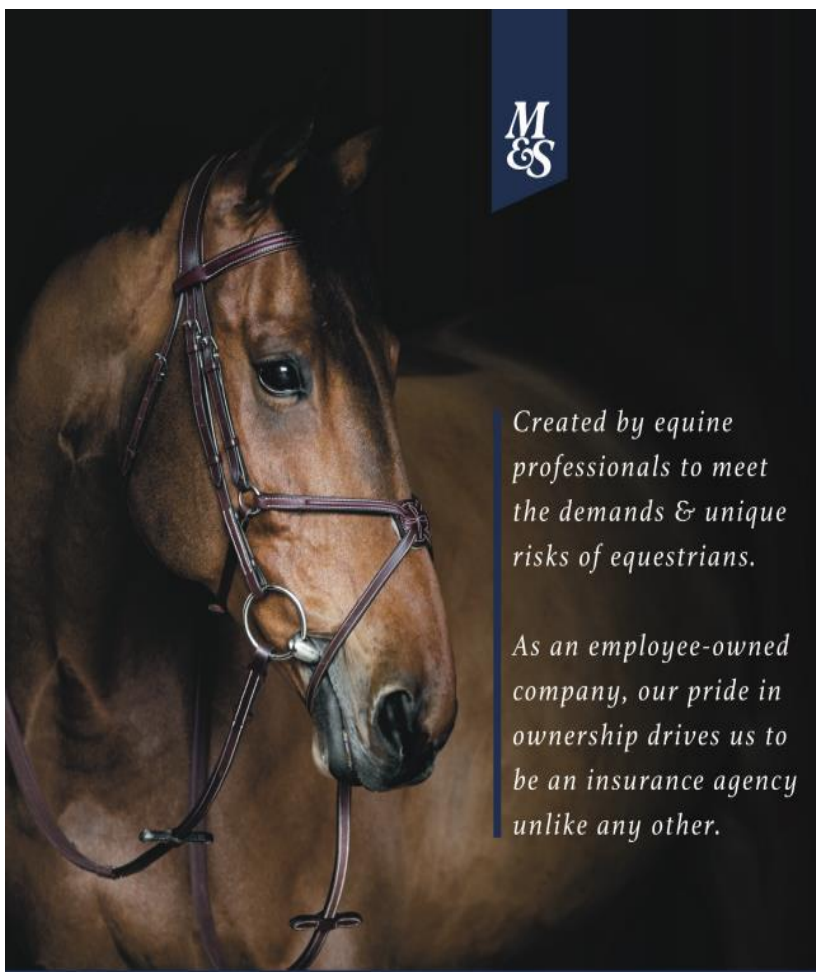

Open to all Horses/Ponies. To be shown as a two round classic. Fences at 3'-horses, 2'6"-lg.ponies and 2' small & medium ponies. These classes are eligible for special year end awards and trophies. Riders must be entered in (1) other child/adult hunter class.

Model – (Horse) Open to all. To be shown in hand or bridle. Judged on confirmation and handling. Rider's attire must be appropriate to their discipline.

Showmanship -- (Horse/Rider) Open to all Exhibitors, judged in hand with emphasis on overall appearance, conditioning, maneuverability, and manners of both Horse and exhibitor. A pattern will be required. This is a presentation class.

Western Junior/Youth Walk Jog (Horse/Rider) Open to all Junior and Youth riders age 18 and under as of the current show year. This division is designed for riders that have not mastered the lope or prefer not to lope. A rider/horse pair may not cross enter to any class that required a lope/canter at the same show. Two hands can be used with any bit on any age horse. Class may be split Junior 13 and under, and Youth 14-18, if entries warrant.

Ranch Horse Pleasure (Horse) Open to all, division is meant for the work ranch horse type. The Horse should work at a forward working speed rather than the typical western pleasure horse, while remaining under control at all times. Horses are shown with light contact on the reins. Excessive silver or bling on saddles and bridles are not allowed. Competitors should wear a long sleeve shirt with collar, boots with heels and western hat. Hard hats required for 18 years and under.
