B may not cross enter into any other divisions except Beginner Rider Equitation and Pleasure. Trotting anywhere on course not to be penalized.

Riders may not cross enter into any other division.

WESTERN Horsemanship - Open to all To evaluate the riders ability to execute, in concert with their horse, a set of maneuver prescribed by the judge with precision and smoothness while exhibiting poise and confidence, and maintaining a blanched, functional and fundamental correct body position.

WESTERN Showmanship — Open to all To be judged on the three basics leading at the walk, leading at the jog/trot, stopping backing, setting up for inspection, and pivoting.

89. Western Showmanship

Western Ranch Riding – Open to all, this class measures a horses ability to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. This class encourages a natural headset and extended gaits are often called for such as a extended walk, trot and lope.

90. Western Ranch Riding

Western Pleasure - The horse should be well broke, relaxed, quiet, soft and cadenced at all gaits. The horse should be ridden responsive to the rider and make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner.
